

FRIDAY MEMO

August 19, 2005

1. On August 16, 2005, the City Council upheld the Planning Commission's decision ruling that the property located 2540 SE Lark Street (Island Station neighborhood) could house no more than 3 dwelling units. In addition, the Council approved a modified plan for the North Clackamas Park youth ball fields project. The proposal eliminates the dedicated soccer field but provides a shared use field for youth soccer in the outfield of the larger ball field. Other minor modifications were also approved. Parks District staff can be reached at 503-794-8002 for details on the plan.
2. The Panattoni Development industrial development at Harmony Road and International Way is fully under way. Up to 80,000 square feet of new industrial buildings will be developed. Building permits for new structures are presently being reviewed. Traffic signal improvements will be completed prior to occupancy of the site.
3. Jackson Street between Main Street and McLoughlin Boulevard will soon see more on-street parking. TriMet has changed the way it handles a couple of bus routes, thereby eliminating the need for the existing bus layover pad at that location.
4. Gramor Development announced recently that it would be proceeding with demolition of houses on along Oak Street and on the south side of Myrtle Street between Highway 224 and Campbell Street to make way for a new shopping center. Once submitted, the Planning Commission will review the plan. The project is made possible by the prior rezoning of the site from residential to commercial following review by the Planning Commission and the City Council.
5. The Linwood Neighborhood Association annual neighborhood block party/picnic will be held on August 23, 2005 from 6:30 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. The location is Woodhaven Street between 55th and Stanley.
6. And don't forget the Stanley Park concert on Wednesday, August 24, 2005 from noon to 1:00 P.M. at the Library and the Ardenwald Summer Concert on Thursday, August 25, 2005 starting at 7:00 P.M. in Ardenwald Park.
