December 12, 2008

1. Don't miss tonight's Winter Solstice Event at the Milwaukie Riverfront Park. Come warm by the bonfire at the Jefferson Street Boat Ramp on Friday, December 12 and watch the Christmas Ship fleet cruise the Willamette. The Dickens Carolers will perform at 6 p.m. and the ships are expected to pass by the Milwaukie Riverfront Park at approximately 7 p.m. Local neighborhood groups will be selling snacks and beverages. This free event is a fun time for the entire family, and we hope to see you there.
2. The final free leaf drop of the year is this Saturday, December 13, from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. at 6101 SE Johnson Creek Boulevard. Enjoy the benefits of a leaf-free yard while helping reduce localized flooding during heavy rains and improving the quality of water going into our streams and rivers.

7. The Ledding Library will collect toys through December 20 to donate to local schools and the Annie Ross House. The greatest needs are for children 12 and under, so please drop off new, unwrapped toys at the front desk.
8. Plan on ringing in the New Year at the Ledding Library's First Saturday Concert with the Joe Powers Duo. Harmonica sensation Joe Powers and guitarist Lewis Child will put on a performance you will not soon forget. 9. Noted Portland poet, writer, and translator Carlos Reyes read to a full house at the December 10 Milwaukie Poetry Series, and popular local artist Christopher Bibby showed his paintings.

David Biespiel will be the guest poet in January. Mr. Biespiel is the Director and Writer-in-Residence of the Attic Writers' Workshop. Among his honors are a Wallace Stegner Fellowship in poetry at Stanford University, a Lannan Fellowship in poetry, and a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship in literature. He has taught at Stanford, George Washington University, University of Maryland, and Portland State University. He has been the Richard H. Thornton Writer-in-Residence at Lynchburg College in Virginia. He currently divides his teaching among three universities: in the fall as the Visiting Poet at Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, in the spring as an Adjunct Professor at Oregon State University, and in the summer on the faculty of the low-residency M.F.A. Program at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington. Readings are scheduled the second Wednesday of each month through June 2009 at the Ledding Library Pond House, 2215 SE Harrison Street. The Milwaukie Marketplace Starbucks is graciously donating coffee for all the readings this season. For a complete season schedule see attachment 2.

10. The City of Milwaukie will announce a request for bids (RFB) for the construction of Spring Park on Monday, December 15th. Bids will be due on January 9, 2009. The engineer's estimate for this project is between \$60,000 and \$80,000. When complete, Spring Park will include:
  - Small play structure that is ADA accessible
  - Three parking spaces constructed with permeable pavement
  - Gravel entrance pathway made of decomposed granite
  - Locking pavers in southern and eastern section

- Turf grass lawn in northern front area
- Native plantings in southern back section
- Red Alder ring around park
- Ornamental plantings in front
- Mound at west for venture play
- Irrigation for grass and plants
- Picnic tables

Spring Park is a 6.87-acre parcel located south of Sparrow Street and west of 19th Avenue in the Island Station neighborhood. Neighborhood volunteers have logged hundreds of hours over the last several years to clear out invasive species and plant native plants. The Master Plan for Spring Park was completed in 2006 with extensive neighborhood involvement. Design services for the park plan were donated by Pat Lando of Lando and Associates Landscape Architecture. The Park will be substantially done by October 2009.

11. In May 2007 Dick and Sally Shook came to Council seeking approval to name the creeklette in North Clackamas Park "Camas Creek." After a lot of hard work and patience on the parts of the Shooks and Friends of North Clackamas Park, the Board on Geographic Names recently approved the new name. See attachment 3 for the official determination.
12. If you find yourself with time on your hands during the holiday break and feel creative, Drive Less Save More is sponsoring a video challenge. 13. At the December 16 City Council work session applicants will be interviewed for the Library Board and Planning Commission. At this time Council has two interviews scheduled for the interim mayor position. Staff will provide a report and seek direction on developing a business recycling requirement ordinance. At the regular session Council will honor Jim Bernard for his service to the community as mayor since 2001. Staff will report on the Street Surface Maintenance Program and Community Development Block Grant projects. Code amendments related to the Kellogg Treatment Plant will once again be considered for continuance and the ordinance vacating a portion of Kellogg Creek Drive in North Clackamas Park will be read a second time.

Thanks to the recently installed Granicus product those with access to a computer and an Internet connection will be able to watch City Council work sessions and regular session wherever and whenever they want. Meetings will be streamed live from the City's website, and as the archive grows, past meetings will be available for viewing as well. The archived video will be available the morning after the meeting. Dear Mr. Shawn:

This is to inform you that the U.S. Board on Geographic Names, at its November 13, 2008 meeting, approved the proposal to apply the new name Camas Creek to a stream in the City of Milwaukie. The new name has been entered into the Geographic Names Information System, the nation's official geographic names repository, which is available and searchable online at <http://geonames.usgs.gov>. The entry reads as follows:

**Camas Creek:** stream; 0.3 km (0.2 mi) long; in the City of Milwaukie, heads at 45°25'39"N, 122°36'23"W, flows W through North Clackamas Park to enter Mount Scott Creek; named in recognition of the camas flowers that have been planted to aid in the stream's restoration; Clackamas County, Oregon; Sec 6, T2S, R2E, Willamette Mer.; 45°25'35"N, 122°36'45"W; USGS map – Gladstone 1:24,000.
