OTHER BUSINESS

<u>Amend Municipal Code Section 5.08.080 – Transfer or Assignment of Receipts</u> and Establish a Fee for Processing

Swanson provided the staff report in which the City Council was requested to adopt an ordinance that would allow a current business tax receipt to be transferred with the relocation of a business at no additional fees except for processing. The code amendment was requested by the City Council after considering public comment on the current process. In a related action the City Council was asked to adopt a resolution establishing a \$5 processing fee for such transfers.

It was moved by Mayor Bernard and seconded by Councilor King to read the ordinance amending Municipal Code Section 5.08.080, transfer or assignment of receipts, for the first time by title only. Motion passed unanimously among the members present. The ordinance was read for the first time by title only.

It was moved by Councilor King and seconded by Councilor Lancaster to read the ordinance amending Municipal Code Section 5.08.080, transfer or assignment of receipts, for the second time by title only. Motion passed unanimously among the members present. The ordinance was read for the second time by title only.

It was moved by Councilor Lancaster and seconded by Councilor Newman to adopt the ordinance amending Municipal Code Section 5.08.080, transfer or assignment of receipts. Motion passed unanimously among the members present.
